The majority of these transfers were moved at the SWP facilities for both federal and state water contractors. Typically transfers must petition the SWRCB for a temporary change in the place of use; and for the majority of those who petitioned, they have received approval. And, in order for these transfers to be moved at the Projects' facilities, the Projects maintained compliance with the appropriate regulatory requirements.
