- Operational Updates
 - O CVP: Lewiston (Trinity River) releases are 2,000 cfs (pulse flow began on April 15). Whiskeytown (Clear Creek) releases are 200 cfs. Keswick (Sacramento River) releases are at 3,250 cfs. Nimbus (American River) releases are 1,000 cfs. Goodwin (Stanislaus River) releases are at 750 cfs (pulse flow began on April 18). Reclamation's Delta pumping is at 1 unit targeting 900 cfs. Federal share of San Luis Reservoir is 354 TAF.
 - o Inflows are coming out ahead of April 1 projections: 120 TAF over inflows that were projected for Folsom reservoir and 20-25 TAF over what was projected for

- Shasta and New Melones reservoirs. Above-projected inflows at Folsom reservoir could last into May.
- SWP: Oroville-Thermalito Complex (Feather River) releases are at 800 cfs. DWR is exporting 600 cfs at Banks Pumping Plant. State share of San Luis Reservoir is 592 TAF.
- O Inflows into Lake Oroville are a couple of hundred-thousand-acre feet above early April projections. Storage in Oroville reservoir is at 1.86 MAF; still gaining in storage into first week of May.

 - Finalizing the joint DWR and Reclamation update to the Drought Contingency Plan; it will be submitted to CDFW and circulated to the WOMT agencies on Friday (4/29); it also includes Condition 3 items that were part of February order on reconsideration of the 2021 TUCP, so will be submitted to SWRCB as well.

and draft proposed changes to emergency regulations for curtailments were
released along with a notice of a public workshop on both to be held on May

- 12. The comment period on the updated Water Unavailability Methodology and draft proposed changes to emergency regulations for curtailments closes on May 19.
- Hydrology Update (DWR and Reclamation)
 - Nothing in near-term forecast; not seeing strong signals that there will be no precipitation in May.
- TUCP/TUCO & Drought Updates
 - Temporary Urgency Change Petition (TUCP), TUC Order (TUCO), and related documents (including information reported by Reclamation and DWR) are available online at
 - https://www.waterboards.ca.gov/waterrights/water_issues/programs/drought/tucp/index.html.
 - O Potential for another TUCP later in the year: DWR and Reclamation said that conditions are better than they were a month ago with respect to inflows and accretions, but it is not clear yet whether another TUCP will be needed. The May 1 forecast will be helpful in deciding because, among other information, it will provide an idea of what the depletions will be in the reservoirs.
