- Operational Updates
 - CVP: Lewiston (Trinity River) releases are 2,000 cfs (pulse flow began on April 15). Whiskeytown (Clear Creek) releases are 200 cfs. Keswick (Sacramento River) releases are at 3,250 cfs. Nimbus (American River) releases are 1,000 cfs. Goodwin (Stanislaus River) releases are at 700 cfs (pulse flow began on April 18). Reclamation's Delta pumping is at 1 unit targeting 900 cfs. Federal share of San Luis Reservoir is 357 TAF.

- SWP: Oroville-Thermalito Complex (Feather River) releases are at 800 cfs. DWR is exporting 600 cfs at Banks Pumping Plant. State share of San Luis Reservoir is 594 TAF.

- Upcoming Actions
 - Reclamation:
 - The Final Sacramento River Temperature Management Plan was submitted on Monday (5/2).
 - o FWS:
 - No actions.
 - CDFW:

 - NMFS:
 - Received final temp management plan, pursuant to the IOP; NMFS will be moving forward with an approval letter to Reclamation sometime this week.
 - o DWR:
 - No actions.
 - o SWRCB:
 - Also received the Sacramento River Temperature Management Plan; in the process of developing a response, which is expected out this week.
 - Reminder that on April 19, the updated Water Unavailability Methodology and draft proposed changes to emergency regulations for curtailments were released along with a notice of a public workshop on both to be held on May 12. The comment period on the updated Water Unavailability Methodology and draft proposed changes to emergency regulations for curtailments closes on May 19.
 - The SWRCB is considering how to reflect current Sacramento and Feather River settlement contractor demands and associated possible emergency regulation provisions.

- Next SWRCB meeting for DWR and Reclamation to present on TUCP and drought updates will be on May 24, which is the second SWRCB meeting of May.
- Hydrology Update (DWR and Reclamation)
 - As much as 0.25 to 0.5 in precipitation in the Northern Sierra over the next six days; nothing in near-term forecast for the Central Valley.
 - The May Bulletin 120 is expected out on Monday, May 9.
