- Upcoming Meetings

- Operational Updates
 - CVP: Lewiston (Trinity River) releases are 450 cfs. Whiskeytown (Clear Creek) releases are 200 cfs. Keswick (Sacramento River) releases are at 3,750 cfs. Nimbus (American River) releases are 1,500 cfs. Goodwin (Stanislaus River) releases are at 800 cfs. Reclamation's Delta pumping is at 1 unit targeting 900 cfs. Federal share of San Luis Reservoir is 345 TAF.
 - SWP: Oroville-Thermalito Complex (Feather River) releases are at 2,200 cfs, increasing to 2,500 cfs on Friday (5/27) to coincide with the DCC gates opening for Memorial Day weekend. DWR is exporting 600 cfs at Banks Pumping Plant. (Note that the Weekly

Fish and Water Operations Outlook had an upper range of 700 cfs; this does not reflect a change in SWP pumping above health and safety minimums, but rather, accounts for Byron Bethany Irrigation District increasing their diversions out of Clifton Court Forebay). State share of San Luis Reservoir is 588 TAF.

 - As we are moving into the summertime period, curtailments will be increasing; new curtailment orders will be going out June 1 to be effective June 2.
- Hydrology Update (DWR and Reclamation)
 - Nothing in the near-term forecast.
- TUCP/TUCO & Drought Updates
 - Temporary Urgency Change Petition (TUCP), TUC Order (TUCO), and related documents (including information reported by Reclamation and DWR) are available online at

- DWR and Reclamation provided an update at the SWRCB meeting yesterday (5/24) and indicated that a TUCP would not be needed for July and August 2022, primarily because of improved storage in Oroville and Folsom reservoirs due to the April storms.
- Discussion Items
 - Sacramento River Temperature Management (real time conditions): No update during WOMT today; the weekly consultation update will be covered during the Shasta Planning Group meeting on Friday (5/27). USFWS reiterated their concern that their agency reps for WOMT are not the same as for the Shasta Planning Group, so they will need advanced notice if the weekly consultation on this topic is covered at WOMT.
