On behalf of the Lewiston Community Services District (LCSD), North State Resources, Inc. (NSR) is conducting a cultural resources survey for the Lewiston Community Services District Wastewater Project, Trinity County, California. LCSD is proposing to consolidate, and replace/upgrade three existing sewer collection, treatment and disposal facilities—Lewiston Park Mutual Water Company (LPMWC), Trinity Dam Mobile Home Park (TDMHP), and LCSD (formerly Lewiston Valley Water Company (LVWC))—that currently provide water and/or wastewater service to the majority of residences in Lewiston, Trinity County, California. The project is located on the *Lewiston, California* USGS 7.5 minute topographic quadrangle map in Sections 17, 19, and 20 of Township 33 North, Range 8 West, of the Mount Diablo Baseline Meridian (see Figure 1, enclosed).

A search of the Sacred Land files by the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) was conducted, with negative results. As noted by the NAHC, the absence of specific site information in the Sacred Lands File does not indicate the absence of Native American cultural resources. Therefore, pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (36 CFR 800.3(f)), NSR is soliciting input from appropriate individuals, organizations, and contacts in an attempt to identify "historic properties," which refer to archaeological and historic sites, and places that may have cultural or traditional significance in or near to the project area. The NAHC has identified you as a Native American tribal representative that may have knowledge concerning cultural resources within the project area and may be able to assist with the planning phase of this project. The planning phase, also known as the "inventory" process, allows NSR to prepare informed assessments of the sensitivity of the project area in relationship to potential cultural resources that may be present in the Area of Potential Effects (APE).



Conversation Notes:

She responded later in the day noting that the projects were outside of their traditional territory and that it lies within Nor-Rei-Muk Wintu territory. She provided the name Ted Dawson and phone number to reach him at from the Nor-Rei-Muk tribe, and stated that if NSR is not able to get ahold of Mr. Dawson to email her again and she will provide input.

Ms. Asaro emailed Ms. Hayward to request her input since she was not able to successfully get ahold of Mr. Dawson.

Ms. Asaro spoke with Ms. Hayward on 08/02/2017 and confirmed that the APE is not considered a culturally sensitive area; however, if any prehistoric archaeological artifacts are found then she would like to be contacted.
