Nature of Action: The proposed action is to enhance base security by extending two culverts under the purview of the Bureau of Reclamation along Pasture Road into NAS Fallon in order to improve the base perimeter fence.

The purpose of this project is to provide a more secure perimeter fence along Pasture Road. Security requirements at these irrigation ditches are not met with the existing configurations. Access into the base property is readily available by moving the swing gates at these locations. In order to provide a more secure perimeter fence, it is necessary to extend the two culverts into the Base, level the area along Pasture Road on both sides of the fence and realign the fence vertically to attain this goal.

This project will extend the 36-inch culvert in the L-8-2-1 lateral south of Drumm Lane. The existing culvert stops short of the base perimeter fence along Pasture Road. A swing trash gate is suspended from the existing chain-link fence into the open ditch under the fence. This project will extend the culvert into Navy property, backfill over the culvert extension and provide a more secure fence structure at this location. The Drain Ditch north of the West Gate at Pasture Road will also be extended into the Base property. A concrete headwall at the terminus of the pipe will be installed (at both culverts). Backfill material will be placed over the culvert to provide fill to the bottom of the fence. The fence sections will be removed and replaced to provide a continuous level fence for each crossing. Reclamation will write a consent letter authorizing construction within the right-of-way held by the United States.



The United States Navy (Navy) will be extending two Reclamation-owned culverts that are situated on Navy land, to provide better security and prevent unauthorized access onto the Naval Air Station (NAS) in Fallon, Nevada. The project is located along Pasture Road, along the perimeter of the NAS in section 10, T. 18 N., R. 29 E., in Churchill County, Nevada.

The Navy assumed lead federal agency status as the culverts are on their property and they will be implementing the project. The Navy prepared documentation for compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA). This documentation included the evaluation of two Reclamation-owned conveyance features, which are part of the Newlands Project (the L8-2-1 Lateral and the Lower Diagonal 1 Drain) located within the project area of potential effects (APE), and analysis to determine the finding effect for project implementation (no effect on historic properties per their Programmatic Agreement with SHPO).

Reclamation had the opportunity to review and comment on the documentation the Navy prepared. The Navy consulted with the Nevada State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) and the SHPO concurred with their determinations by email on September 13, 2011. Once the hard copy SHPO concurrence letter has been received by the Navy and forwarded to Reclamation, a copy will be provided for your files.

Reclamation accepts the Navy as the lead federal agency for this undertaking. Since Navy has completed the Section 106 review as the lead agency, this e-mail concludes Reclamation's Section 106 review process. Please retain a copy of this e-mail with the project files.

If cultural resources or human remains are inadvertently discovered during project construction, the Navy would have additional cultural resource obligations as the lead Federal agency. These additional obligation may include consultation with the SHPO and others as appropriate.
